Course Objectives:

This practical course is given to Fifth year dental students as an extended course throughout the first and second semesters.

In the first semester:

- 1- Students are required to prepare seminars and to present it to the rest of the group (20 marks).
 - **Content**: <u>one</u>, <u>non-review</u>, recent research paper selected by the student about a topic related to oral medicine.
 - Presented using PowerPoint.
 - Two presentations each time (one hour for every student)
 - The presentation should not exceed **30 minutes**.
 - Additional 30 minutes should be used to discuss the paper in terms of aims, methodology, results, and scientific content.
 - Student will be given 20 marks evaluating the following sections (see appendix):
 - Quality of the paper selected by the student
 - Quality of slides
 - Performance of the presenter during the presentation
 - Ability of the presenter to answer questions during discussion
 - Punctuality

2- Literature review (10 marks):

- At least **5 pages**.
- **Source**: recent articles about the specified topic selected by the student.
- Should include the following **sections**:
 - i. Title page,
 - ii. Introduction and aims
 - iii. Literature review,
 - iv. Conclusions, and
 - v. References.

Aims and Objectives:

- To introduce the students to the basics of scientific research.
- To gain knowledge of scientific literature survey.
- To develop skills related to scientific article evaluation.
- To learn the basics of writing a literature review about a selected topic.
- To learn how to prepare and present a scientific seminar using the power Point

In the second semester:

Seminars about all oral medicine topics will be given to the students by the supervisors. Students are required to participate actively in the slide presentation of different clinical cases in the form of describing the lesions, providing differential diagnosis, and planning the treatment.

Course contents:

- 1. Oral ulcerations and vesiculobullous diseases.
- 2. Lip and tongue disorders.
- 3. White and red lesions.
- 4. Oral cancer and soft tissue benign tumors.
- 5. Salivary gland diseases.
- 6. Oral pigmentation.
- 7. Oral manifestation of systemic diseases.

These seminars compromise a complete revision of oral medicine diseases regarding its etiology, clinical features, diagnosis and management supplemented by photos.

Student will be evaluated as:

- 10 marks: for their contribution in the seminars discussions
- 20 marks: for an online exam of clinical cases discussed during the semester.

Teaching Methods

Duration: 32 weeks in first and second semester.

Seminars: Each seminar is 2 hours

Tests and Evaluation:

1. Continuous assessment (60%): 30% for project presentation and literature review in the first semester and 30% for seminar contribution and an online exam in the second semester.

2. Final exam (40%): Online exam (20%) and Oral exam (20%).
