## **Course Objectives:**

- To teach the students how to describe the clinical and radiological features of the most common and important oral diseases discussed in Oral Pathology Theory 1 (1301354).
- To enable the students to review the histopathological features of the most important and common oral diseases discussed in Oral Pathology Theory 1 (1301354).
- To stimulate the cognitive abilities of the students by analysing the various features of the disease to reach the correct diagnosis.
- To teach the student how to write short notes about a disease that includes its most important features.

 To train students how to gather information about some important concepts using the internet or published scientific papers.

#### **Learning Outcomes**:

- D2) Work effectively in examining patients and recognizing normal oral anatomy and variations of normal.

## **Teaching methods**:

- Duration: 8 weeks, 16 hours in total.
- Tutorial sessions: one tutorial session of 2-hour duration every week.

#### **Modes of assessment**:

 Students are assessed throughout the semester with requirements accounting for 60% of the mark and the final exam accounting for 40%.

#### • 60% Continuous assessment:

• **30% Quizzes:** 4 (5-10-minute) quizzes at the beginning of the tutorial session. The quiz with the lowest mark will not be considered for the student.

- 10% Tutorial contribution.
- 20% Midterm exam: slide interpretation.
- 40% **Final Exam:** slide interpretation.

## **Attendance policy:**

Tutorial session attendance is obligatory. You are responsible for all the material covered in the tutorial sessions since you could be asked about it in the midterm or final exam of Oral Pathology Theory 1 (1301354).
