18. Course Description:

This is a postgraduate course aiming to provide students with practically oriented knowledge on the dental management of patients with systemic diseases.

The course is given as seminars and case discussions 2 hours/week.

The course discusses the prosthodontic considerations in various medical conditions including diabetes, osteoporosis, cancer therapy, sleep apnoea and other related topics.

- 1- To provide practically oriented knowledge about prosthodontic management of medically complex patients.
- 2- To enhance the basic principles of special care dentistry; applying the principles of medical assessment to the oral care patient setting

- 1- Know the common medical conditions encountered in prosthodontics
- 2- Know the oral manifestations of systemic diseases relevant to prosthodontics

3- Appreciate the interaction between systemic health and oral health

- 5- Adjust dental treatment plan according to patient's medical status
- 6- Choose the appropriate prosthodontic treatment options that fit the patient's medical status
